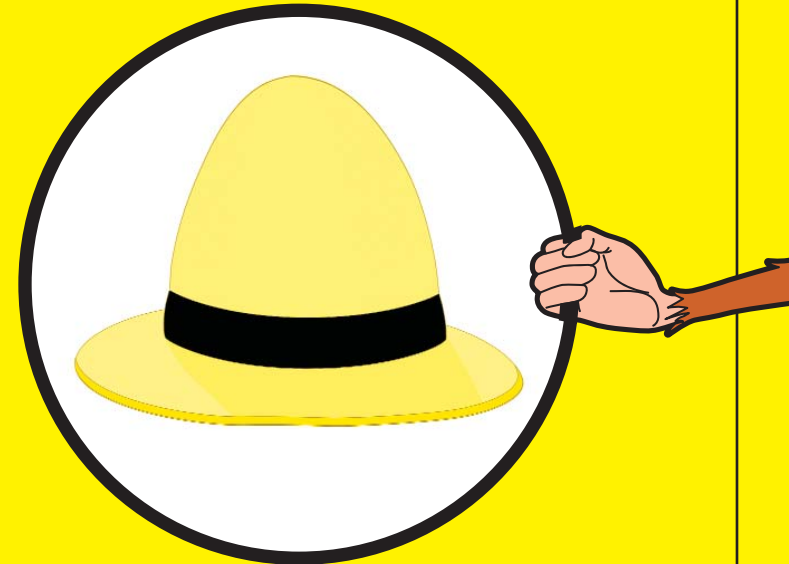

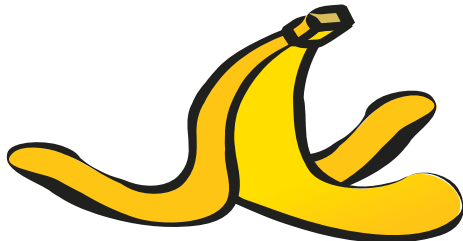

Curious George Saves the Day: The Art of Margret and H.A. Rey

Please join the Young Leadership Associates of the American Society for Yad Vashem at The Jewish Museum and view this new exhibit highlighting the art of the Reys and their beloved character, Curious George. Famous for his ability to “save the day” George was saved from the horrors of the Holocaust by the Reys. Margret and H.A. Rey fled Paris in 1940 with the Curious George manuscript strapped to their bicycles.

The exhibit features nearly eighty original drawings and preparatory dummies for Margret and H. A. Rey children’s books as well as documentation related to their escape from Nazi-occupied Europe. It examines the parallels between the obstacles the Reys faced and the drawings that may have saved their lives. The story of their life in Paris and narrow escape is also told through an interactive timeline.

Since 1997, the American Society for Yad Vashem’s Young Leadership Associates have been raising funds to educate teachers about how to successfully communicate the lessons of the Holocaust to their students. Proceeds from this event will benefit education programs sponsored by the American Society for Yad Vashem’s Young Leadership Associates. Holocaust education programs provide a context for exploring the dangers of remaining silent and indifferent in the face of the oppression of others.
